Introduction

Our Vision

A society where no child indulges into criminality due to absence of appropriate care.

Our Mission

To create conditions for children especially orphans to live normal life and attain their full potential as normal citizen of the country.

Khpal Kor Foundation is a reputable non-profit community driven by charitable organization registered under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance 1961 (XLVI of 1961) with Department of Social Welfare Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. It has also been granted approval as NPO (Non-Profit Organization) under section 2 (36) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. Khpal Kor Foundation Charity Commission under Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Charities Act, 2019, also have signed a Memorandum of Understanding- (MOU) with Economic Affairs Division, Government of Pakistan for Orphans Sponsorship Projects while certification as a Non-Profit Organization (NPO) by the Pakistan Center for Philanthropy (PCP) has also been achieved.

Khpal Kor Foundation started its services initially with only 05 orphans in the year 1996, has now turned into a huge success, serving several hundred orphan children, many of them have now become doctors, engineers and other top professionals. The organization runs a well-reputed institution with the name of Khpal Kor Model School & College (Boys' Campus & Girls' Campus) where orphans are getting free of cost quality education together with the children from community who pay monthly a nominal fee which helps to cover salaries of the staff. Khpal Kor Village has also been established where under age orphans (Boys & Girls) are getting education from (Grade Nursery to Grade Three) and are living in residential flats being provided with a family style living environment, they are being cared and looked after by paid educated mothers and served by a trained *Khala* for cooking and laundry services. Presently Khpal Kor Foundation is actively engaged in the construction of Khpal Kor Nursing & Health Sciences College. The finishing work is in final stages, this college will be operational in September 2025.

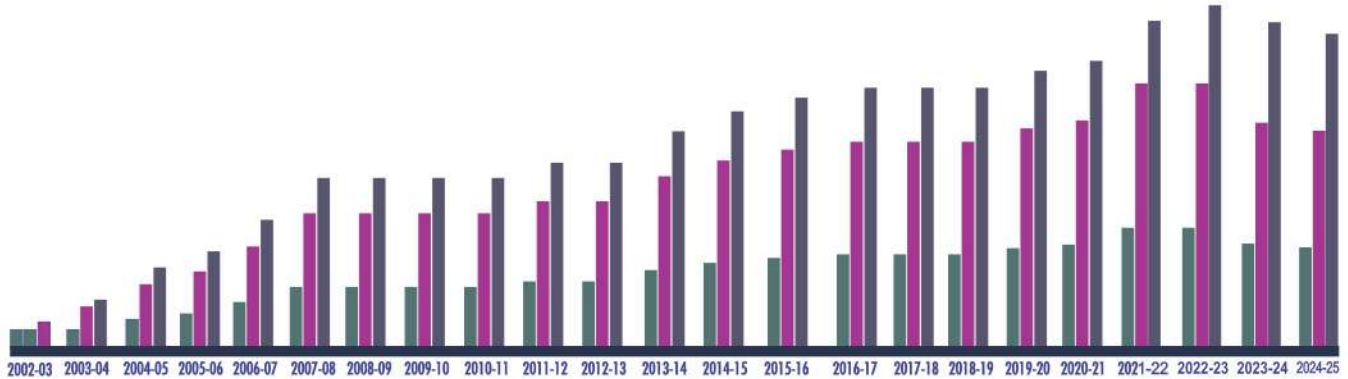

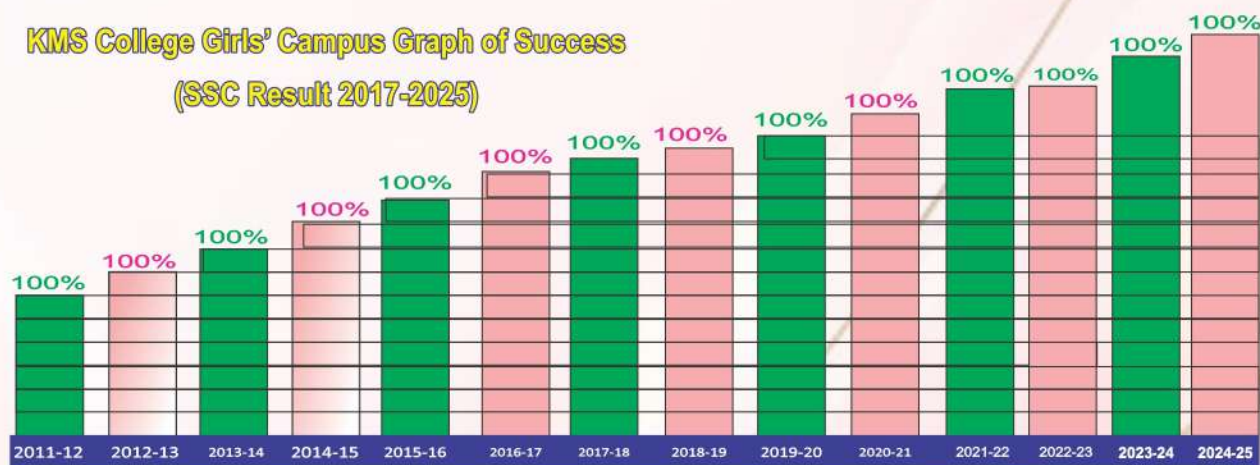

Updates on the construction of “The Bank of Khyber Auditorium” at Khpal Kor Village, Sherarai, Swat

The Bank of Khyber Auditorium project has been successfully completed. The structural work was funded by Rs. 10 million under the Bank of Khyber's CSR initiative. Despite rising inflation, Khpal Kor Foundation ensured completion of the remaining work. The finishing phase was completed through the foundation's own resources. The auditorium now has a seating capacity of 300. It will be used for examinations, functions, and educational activities. The facility will serve orphan boys and girls of Khpal Kor Village. It will also support students of Khpal Kor Nursing & Health Sciences College. The auditorium will be rented out during free times for income generation. This will help support operational expenses of the foundation. The Bank of Khyber is also sponsoring eight orphan children under its CSR program.



Purchase Land for Sports Ground at Khpal Kor Nursing College

Khpal Kor Foundation is continuously making all-out efforts to enhance its capacity, strength, and the number of beneficiaries, with the aim of scaling up its humanitarian and educational services. In this regard, the organization has successfully acquired additional land measuring 20,253 square feet at Khpal Kor Village, Sherarai. This newly purchased land will primarily be developed as a sports ground for the students of Khpal Kor Village and Khpal Kor Nursing & Health Sciences College, providing healthy recreational and physical development opportunities.





Updates on the construction of Khpal Kor Nursing & Health Sciences College



This Mega Project Khpal Kor Nursing & Health Sciences College, Sherarai Swat, is a unique and landmark initiative in Pakistan, as it is the first nursing and health sciences college specifically designed for orphan students along with community participation. This high-impact project, funded by the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with Rs. 150 million, has now been successfully completed. The college is being developed with a special inclusive model where 60% of students are orphans and 40% come from the local community. Orphan students will receive completely free education, while community students will contribute through reasonable fees to support sustainability. This model ensures both social welfare and institutional self-reliance. The college will provide professional education in nursing and health sciences at the local level. It will open new opportunities for orphan students to become skilled healthcare professionals. This initiative will significantly improve access to quality education in Swat and beyond. The project stands as a symbol of compassion, innovation, and sustainable development. It will contribute to strengthening the healthcare system of Pakistan. Khpal Kor Foundation proudly presents this as a first-of-its-kind achievement in the country.

Amir Alam MBBS Doctor



A Story of Courage, Loss, and Unbreakable Determination

Born on 15 May 2005 in a small town in Shangla, Amir Alam's life took a tragic turn when he became an orphan on 10 January 2020 after his father passed away due to asthma and a chronic chest infection.

Despite this heartbreaking loss, Amir remained committed to his education. He completed his primary schooling at IPMS and later studied at GCMHS Alpuri, where he secured excellent marks and consistently ranked among the top 3 students in his class. In October 2021, Amir was admitted to the Khpal Kor Foundation in the first year of FSC, marking the beginning of his remarkable journey. He excelled academically, holding 1st position in both the first and second years. He scored 510/1100 in the first year and 502/1100 in the second year. Beyond studies, he actively participated in presentations and co-curricular activities.

His heart was set on one noble goal to become a Doctor, Amir began his MDCAT preparation at Khpal Kor Foundation. In 2024, he scored an impressive 176/200 but was not selected on open merit for a medical college. However, instead of giving up, he doubled his efforts.

In MDCAT 2025, he achieved 172/180 with an aggregate of 93.75% —and was successfully selected on open merit for an MBBS seat at Nowshera Medical College (NMC).

Now a first-year MBBS student at Nowshera Medical College, Amir Alam continues to move forward with faith and determination. he will become a doctor in the near future InshaAllah..

I belong to Durushkhela, Matta Swat. I lost my father in the battle of Talibanization in 2009. Then my uncle admitted me and my little sister to Khpal Kor Model School and College Girls Campus a project of Khpal Kor Foundation.

Since my home was far away, I lived in the hostel. The hostel's dedicated studies area and other facilities helped me focus on my studies. I secured 1st position in my class from 3rd to 2nd year. I passed my matriculation with 1097 marks and secured first rank in my class. I also secured first position in FSc with 1034 marks. As I wanted to become a doctor, after FSc, I studied for the medical entrance test and Alhandullilah I cleared my MDCAT with 180 marks and got admission in Saidu Medical College. Now I am a student of 2nd year MBBS. Besides studies, I also participated in various competitions and sports like volleyball. I also received regular, obedient, and clean student awards. I received certificates in presentation competitions in our school and in district-level essay competitions. I received the Best Student of the Year award. Orphans Sponsorship Program (OSP)



Since its inception, Khpal Kor Foundation has been running the orphans sponsorship program in accordance with its mission. Started with sponsoring only five children, the program has now turned into a great success benefitting 483 orphans (Boys & Girls) from District Swat and other areas of Malakand Division. Under this program, the orphans (Boys & Girls) are provided with free of cost quality education (Boys & Girls) from Nursery to Fsc (Grad XII) along with standard boarding and healthcare facilities. The program is being funded by reputable organization like ISRA-UK "Feed the Poor", Heart Canada", and Pakistani diaspora abroad while Qatar Charity, directly, support students financially in the program. Under this program orphans are first registered through a registration form including their relevant and complete information which are verified through visits and then are granted admissions with support from sponsor(s). The concerned sponsor(s) are provided with regular updates about the academic, co-curricular and health status of their sponsored children on quarterly basis. The sponsors can pay the sponsorship cost either monthly, quarterly or annually.

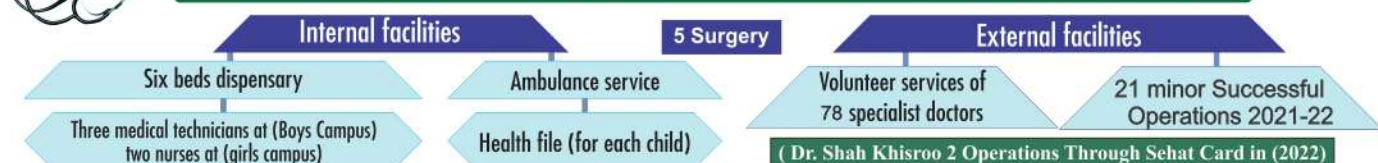

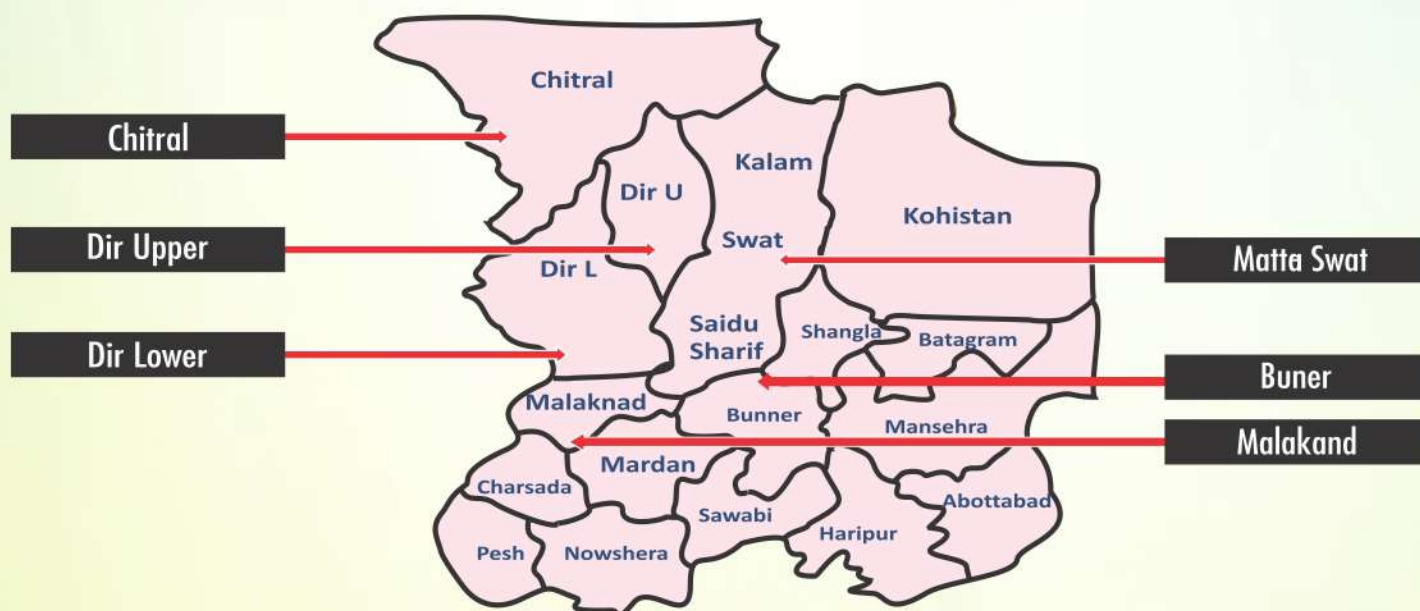

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

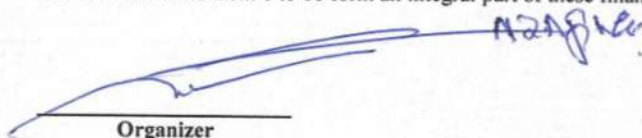

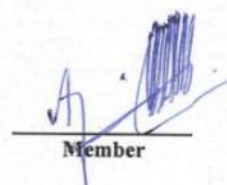

1 THE ORGANIZATION AND ITS OPERATIONS

The Foundation was registered in Pakistan on 10th of August, 1998 as KHPAL KOR FOUNDATION under registration number 1402 under Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration & Control) Ordinance, 1961 (XLVI of 1961). The registered office of the Foundation is situated at Makanbagh Mingora district Swat. The Principal activity of the foundation is to take care of the accommodation, nutrition, educational and recreational needs of orphan children. The foundation is governed by executive committee having 16 members . The funds for the Foundation are provided by members of the Foundation, general public and certain social local and international organizations.

2 Basis of preparation

2.1 Statement of compliance

These Financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan, and the accounting standards for Not for Profit Organizations (NPOs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan.

2.2 Functional and presentation currency

These Financial statement are prepared in Pakistani Rupees which is the company's functional and presentation currency.

2.3 Use of estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. In addition, it requires management to exercise judgment in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. The areas involving a high degree of judgment or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements, are documented in the following accounting policies and notes, and relate primarily to:

Useful lives, residual values and depreciation method of property, plant and equipment

- Provision for doubtful trade receivables
- Estimation of contingent liabilities
- Provision for impairment of inventories

The revisions to accounting estimates (if any) are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

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3 SUMMARY OF MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1 Property and equipment

Initial recognition

All items of property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at cost. Cost of an asset comprises;

- a) purchase price, including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes, after deducting trade discounts and rebates,
- b) any costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management,
- c) the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and removing the item and restoring the site on which it is located, the obligation for which an entity incurs either when the item is acquired or as a consequence of having used the item during a particular period for purposes other than to produce inventories during that period.

Subsequent measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment, are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss (if any).

Depreciation

Depreciation on all property plant and equipment is charge to statement of profit or loss using diminishing balance method. Depreciation is charged from the month when the asset is available for use and no depreciation is charged for the month in which asset is disposed. Gain /loss from disposal of fixed asset is recognized in statement of profit or loss.

3.2 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are carried in the balance sheet at cost. Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, bank deposits and other short term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

3.3 Investments

The investments are recognized at cost, being the fair value of the consideration given including acquisition charges associated therewith.

3.4 Taxation

No provision for taxation has been provided for in these financial statements because the Foundation is situated in Mingora Swat (FATA) which is non-tariff area.

3.5 Government Grant

Grants related to assets are presented in the statement of financial position by setting up the grant as deferred income which is recognized in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the useful life of the related asset.
